Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Ephesians is the 56th book of the Bible. Timothy P. Schehr in his *The Bible Made Easy* (ISBN 978-0-86716-598-2) sees the two main divisions of this book as being “God’s loving plan” (chapters 1-3) and “Our loving response” (chapters 4-6). He also points out that the letter is not specifically addressed to the church at Ephesus, but rather seems to have been directed to the wider area of western Turkey, Ephesus being where one might best send a letter in that day for such broad dispersal. Paul stayed in Ephesus for several years (54-57 A.D.) and it is felt that he probably wrote this letter back to the church of this area from the time of his house arrest in Rome (61-63 A.D.), though some believe it may have even been sent from the hand of one of Paul’s disciples sometime after Paul’s own death in 67 A.D. In the words of this letter, we find a much kinder salutation than had been sent to the Galatians and also the message that those addressed were chosen (before the world began) to be holy as adopted ones of God sealed by the Holy Spirit (ch. 1), an assurance that they were saved not by things they did to “earn” salvation but by God’s own good grace and, further, that they were aliens no longer but were now one with those who had formerly been the only ones to be considered as God’s chosen people (ch. 2), a description of Paul’s ministry to the Gentiles and a prayer by Paul for his Ephesian readers (ch. 3), a call to unity that is often read during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and a list of rules for the new life now to be lived [including the beautiful one which calls us never to end the day angry with another] (ch. 4), a prescription to take God as our pattern, to avoid foul behavior and speech, to be of the light, and to ascribe to certain morals in the home [Paul gets himself into trouble with many modern readers when he gets to the parts about submission] (ch. 5), and a call to children to be obedient especially since the 4th commandment is the 1st one to come with a promise [which will sound familiar to Star Trek fans of the Vulcan Spock: “Live long and prosper”] (ch. 6:3)—he also goes on to call for a new wardrobe for the believer: wear the armor of God and shoes of eagerness (ch. 6). When you finish this book, you will have read 56 (76.7%) of the 73 books of the Bible, yet 1,248 (93.6%) of the 1,334 chapters of the Bible.

For 2 Sundays, we are covering the 8:30 A.M. Mass in Sodus Point—Fr. Carpenter will be there this week, Fr. Werth next. Monday is the 50th anniversary of the incorporation of St. James Parish. Tuesday, our staff has its summer meeting. Wednesday brings the 89th anniversary of Women’s Right to Vote. Thursday would have been Mother Teresa’s 99th birthday. Friday, Peace of Christ will be well represented at the Red Wings game (watch their scoreboard throughout the evening). Saturday, our Pastoral Council gathers for a time of prayer for all of you in the parish and for all their work in the year to come (it will also have been 4 years since Hurricane Katrina). Next Sunday, welcome Basilian Father Tom Rosica at our 9:45 Mass. Pax!

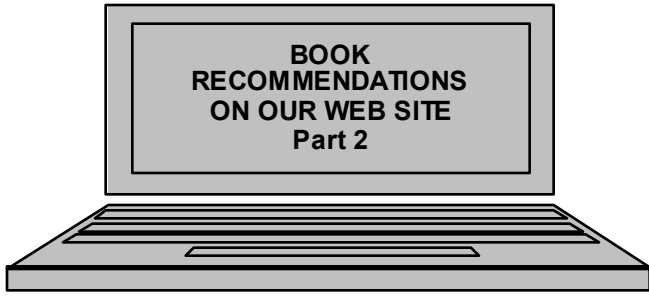

Conversing with God in Scripture: A Contemporary Approach to Lectio Divina by Stephen J. Binz, The Word Among Us Press, Ijamsville MD: 2008 (\$11.95). [145 pp.] ISBN 978-1-59325-126-0

Scripture “becomes a means for God to feed, heal, and love us” (p. 12). Excellent for our diocesan *Spirit Alive’s* move from Year 2 (2009) to Year 3 (2010): through lectio divina we evangelize ourselves (p. 95). Those who have discovered for themselves the rich resource that daily Bible reading can be (even just a few verses each day) will find this book to be helpful.

In This Place: Reflections on the Land of the Gospels for the Liturgical Cycles by Marianne Race, CSJ and Laurie Brink, OP, Wipf & Stock Publishers, Eugene OR: 2008 (\$26.00). [215 pp.] ISBN 978-1-55635-906-4

Whether we’ve ever been to the Holy Land or not, this will take us there by book, and help us better to see those places we hear named each Sunday in the Mass readings and in the words of the homily—not as tourists moving *from* our center, but as pilgrims moving *toward* it (p. 200).

Help My Unbelief by William J. O’Malley, Orbis Books, Maryknoll NY: 2008 (\$15.00). [145 pp.] ISBN 978-1-57075-803-4

This book is not just for inquirers into the faith, but for ourselves as life-long believers. Jesuit Father Bill O’Malley of former local fame writes very candidly right to our hearts. Read about imperfection (p. 102), “the pope in one’s soul” (p. 112), and the magisterium (p. 113). As always, his writing gets us to think about what we believe, and why.

Renewing Parish Culture: Building for a Catholic Church by John J. Piderit, S.J., and Melanie M. Morey, Rowman & Littlefield Publishers, Inc., Lanham MD: 2008 (\$29.95). [274 pp.] ISBN 978-0-7425-5904-2

These power-packed pages are filled with helpful strategies for reinvigorating Catholic culture, especially in pastoral circumstances and settings of uncertainty (p. 178).

CHILDREN, FAMILY, SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FAITH FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION: Brochures are now available that explain our Religious Education program for children in Grades 1-8. Family Gatherings begin the end of September. The dates are in the Faith Formation brochure. Our monthly program for children in Grades 6, 7, and 8 begins the last Sunday in September. Look for dates for that program in a separate brochure.

Sacramental preparation begins with Reconciliation in September and Eucharist and Confirmation in October. Preparation for Reconciliation and First Eucharist are offered again in the Spring. The brochures for each sacrament explain the process for preparing for these sacraments.

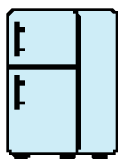

Health Care Reform Overview

The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops supports federal health care reform. Access to health care is a long held Diocesan public policy concern. In September floor votes in Congress will be held that will shape health care in the US for years to come. The US Bishops suggest four criteria for evaluating plans put forth by the President and Congress:

- Does universal coverage respect human life and dignity from conception to natural death?
- Is health care available for all citizens with special concern given for the poor and coverage for legal immigrants included?
- Is the common good recognized and pluralism preserved by including conscience protections and a variety of options?
- Are costs restrained and applied equitably across the spectrum of payers?

You are encouraged to contact your Congressional Representatives and Senators during his or her summer break. Urge him or her to be sure that truly universal access to health care is shaped by the four criteria outlined above.
