Dear Parishioners and Friends,

On this long New Year's Weekend, we wish a happy birthday both to Chung Ma (1/1) of our maintenance staff at St. John the Evangelist, and to Augie Misiurewicz (1/2), our Parish Visitor.

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany, when the magi came bearing their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to the Infant Savior. As such, it also begins National Migration Week when we are particularly mindful of all who move among the countries of our globe providing labor in the fields and/or seeking asylum, security and peace. If you really want to do some self-development in this issue, I would heartily recommend a reading of *This Flowing Toward Me: A Story of God Arriving in Strangers* (ISBN 978-1-59471-197-8). I had mentioned it before as a good Advent book, but it is even more appropriate at this time and can be ordered right through our web site (see bottom of column to the left of this) by clicking the button on the opening screen labeled "Recommended Reading" (or just go directly to <http://www.peaceofchristparish.org/books.php> and you'll be right there). The Foreword to this book is written by Sister Helen Prejean (*Dead Man Walking*) who will be our parish speaker here on Monday, May 3rd. Let us also be mindful in this week of all the migrant workers who come each year to work the farms of our area so that their crops are harvested before they would rot where they grow.

Monday is a good day to make sure that all last-minute donations have reached our parish office if you wish them to be counted toward your charitable giving for your 2009 tax year. All checks dated December 31st or earlier that reach us no later than this Wednesday Noon will be accepted as 2009 donations. Any donations dated January 1st or later, or that reach us *after* Noon on this Wednesday, will be counted as 2010 donations. This applies to all of our regular parish contributions, payments toward our "Peace of Christ Campaign" pledges made last year, or payments toward the current 2009-2010 diocesan *Catholic Ministries Appeal*. Dropping all these off today instead of waiting until Wednesday, though, would be most helpful.

Tuesday is the feast of St. John Neumann, the patron of the Catholic School here at our parish. That same night, our Liturgy Committee will meet to get working on Lent, Holy Week and beyond.

Wednesday is the feast of Brother André who is now a Blessed. He is most associated with St. Joseph Oratory on Montreal's hilltop.

Thursday, we wish a Merry Christmas to all our Orthodox friends.

Friday is the 358th anniversary of the death of Galileo.

Saturday, our latest sunrises of the year (which have been the same since December 29th) begin to yield as our solar star rises ever earlier each day all the way to the summer solstice next June.

Next Sunday brings us to the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord which ends the Christmas Season. As it concludes, I want to thank all who worked so hard on all the liturgies, giving trees, food baskets, poinsettia deliveries, etc. of the season to make it so special for so many. May 2010 be a peaceful and prosperous year for us all!

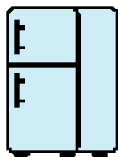

**Small Christian Communities---
From Vision to Reality at
Peace of Christ Parish...**

This is the process that we will be following to accomplish this initiative:

- Solicit a target group of parishioners to determine their interest.
- Call together a core group to experience and help with this initiative.
- Train the members of the core group in the simple procedures of facilitation.

Have the core group help to facilitate the idea of having Lent/Eastertide be a time of exposure to the experience of Small Christian Communities for all who desire it.

Process prior to the Lenten Retreat:

- Bulletin articles regularly appearing on what a Small Christian Community is and why we are moving in this direction.
- Solicit regular support for this from the pulpit.
- Have reference to the idea of Small Christian Communities in the Pastor's Column.
- Put out sign-up sheets in the churches in the weeks before the beginning of Lent and have those who would like to experience the Small Christian Community concept sign up.

Meetings:

- Before Lent call together an informational meeting for those who would be interested in learning more about the Small Christian Community experience.
- Have a second meeting for those who would like to have the experience and who will participate during Lent and Eastertide.
- Look over the listing and group them geographically close to one another. Groups should be no larger than eight.
- Have the groups decide when/where they will meet and provide resources for them.

Members of the core team will help them to get started.

Week of Prayer Service
January 19, 2010
7:00 P.M.

Hopefully, you will be able to gather with us for this annual prayer time where staff from our local churches gather to pray for greater unity among ourselves in our common mission. Graymoor Ecumenical & Interreligious Institute (GEII) gives background for this gathering:

"During the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2010, Christians throughout the world will be listening together to the promise and commission that are part of Christ's final words before his ascension: "You are witnesses of these things."

"Traditionally celebrated between the 18th and the 25th of January (in the northern hemisphere) or at Pentecost (in the southern hemisphere), the Week of Prayer enters into congregations and parishes all over the world. Special ecumenical worship services are arranged and adapted for each area locality.

"The theme for 2010 was chosen in Scotland, where churches were, at the same time, preparing to celebrate the anniversary of the 1910 World Mission Conference on the theme "Witnessing to Christ today", which marked the beginnings of the modern ecumenical movement.

"A brochure with liturgical texts and background information based on the work of a Scottish ecumenical preparatory group was jointly prepared and published by the (Roman Catholic) Pontifical Council for Christian Unity and the Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches.

"The Biblical Theme: You are Witnesses of These Things

In the ecumenical movement we have often meditated on Jesus' final discourse before his death. In this final testament the importance of the unity of Christ's disciples is emphasized: "That all may be one ... so that the world may believe." (John 17.21) This year the churches of Scotland have made the original choice of inviting us to listen to Christ's final discourse before his ascension, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." (Luke 24.46-48). It is on these final words of Christ that we shall reflect each day.

"During the 2010 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity we are invited to follow the whole of chapter 24 of Luke's gospel. Whether it be the terrified women at the tomb, the two discouraged disciples on the road to Emmaus or the eleven disciples overtaken by doubt and fear, all who together encounter the Risen Christ are sent on mission: "You are witness of these things". This mission of the Church is given by Christ and cannot be appropriated by anyone. It is the community of those who have been reconciled with God and in God, and who can witness to the truth of the power of salvation in Jesus Christ.

"We sense that Mary Magdalene, Peter or the two Emmaus disciples will not witness in the same way. Yet it will be the victory of Jesus over death that all will place at the heart of their witness. The personal encounter with the risen One has radically changed their lives and in its uniqueness for each one of them one thing becomes imperative: "You are witnesses of these things." Their story will accentuate different things, sometimes dissent may arise between them about what faithfulness to Christ requires, and yet all will work to announce the Good News."

At our service on January 19th, we will also incorporate the new *Charter for Compassion* which you are welcome to review & sign at <http://charterforcompassion.org/> and we can make our observance for all 8 days. GEII:

"The Eight Days

During the 2010 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity we will reflect each day on chapter 24 of Luke's gospel stopping at the questions which it asks: Jesus' questions to his disciples; the questions the apostles ask of Christ. Each of these questions allows us to highlight a particular way of witnessing to the Risen One. Each of them invites us to think about our situation of church division and about how, concretely, we can remedy that. We are already witnesses and we need to become better witnesses. How?

By praising the One who gives us the gift of life and resurrection (Day 1);

By knowing how to share the story of our faith with others (Day 2);

By recognizing that God is at work in our lives (Day 3);

By giving thanks for the faith we have received (Day 4);

By confessing Christ's victory over all suffering (Day 5);

By seeking to always be more faithful to the Word of God (Day 6);

By growing in faith, hope and love (Day 7);

By offering hospitality and knowing how to receive it when it is offered to us (Day 8).

Would our witness not be more faithful to the gospel of Christ in each of these eight aspects if we witnessed together?"
