Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Happy Father's Day to all fathers in our midst—and may we be mindful of those who have passed and now dwell with Our Father in Heaven! Congratulations, too, to our 2 big **Festival Raffle winners**: to **Annette Stenglein** who won the First Prize of the \$12,500, and to **Jennifer Brooker** who won the \$500 Gift Certificate from Wegmans. Indeed, thanks to *all* who worked or supported Festival 2010 in any way: it was great to see so many happy faces—many of them painted.

Summer begins officially at 7:28 A.M. on Monday, the year's longest day—although the earliest sunrises ended last Friday and the latest sunsets do not commence until this Thursday. Hey, I don't understand it, but it gives us three special days instead of just one!

Tuesday is the feast of St. John Fisher, the patron of the Diocese of Rochester. In honor of it, Bishop Clark invited **Archbishop Dolan** from New York to come celebrate a special 10:30 A.M. 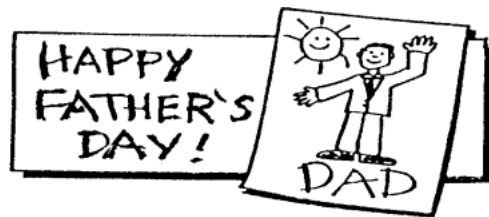

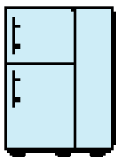

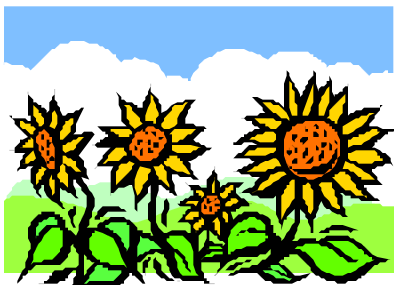

**MEDICAL MISSIONARIES OF MARY
June 26 & 27th**

We, the Medical Missionaries of Mary, are an international missionary congregation of women religious. We strive to look at life beyond the barriers of culture, religion, and language to help the poor, the oppressed and the marginalized. Through our lives of service, we use our presence and activities in promoting health and wholeness: justice, peace and human dignity, reflecting God's healing love to all.

A young, Irish lady named Mary Martin, who went out to work in Nigeria, West Africa as a lay volunteer nurse, established the Congregation in 1937. While she was there, helping to alleviate the sufferings brought on by leprosy, she became very aware of the need for continuity of medical services especially among women at the time of childbirth. We now number about 370 sisters working in nine African countries, as well as Brazil, Honduras, Europe and the USA.

Our sisters are engaged in numerous fields of health care. Some are involved in curative medicine, surgery, or obstetrics, and public health work. Others are working in teaching hospitals. Some work in direct evangelization doing pastoral care in parishes. Still others are in various branches of social work and community development. As most diseases can be prevented if the causes are eliminated, the sisters do this by health education on how to keep the environment healthy: by providing clean water, improved sanitation, and housing. Our sisters are also engaged in ministry to persons living with HIV/Aids which is an urgent need in most places where we work.

We work in some of the poorest and most remote areas of the world, responding to crises in war-torn countries and presently helping to alleviate some of the suffering of the people in refugee and famine relief camps. We are also involved with helping women become entrepreneurs, thus enabling them to become financially independent.

As many of those we serve are unable to pay for medical services, we depend greatly on the support we receive through donor agencies as well as the Propagation of the Faith.

Our benefactors have a very special place in our daily prayers, and we assure them of the unspoken gratitude of those we are privileged to serve. We look forward to telling you about our Mission the weekend of June 26 and 27.

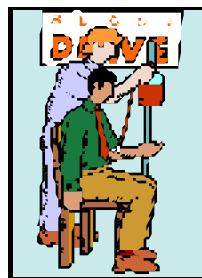

SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE

Below is a report on the Diocesan Public Policy Committee's postcard campaign for comprehensive immigration reform. Thank you for your efforts on behalf of the powerless.

"If a stranger lives with you in your land, do not molest him. You must count him as one of your own countrymen and love him as yourself—for you were once strangers yourselves in Egypt."
Leviticus 19: 32-34

This past February, parishes throughout the Diocese of Rochester participated in a postcard campaign to advocate for comprehensive immigration reform that would "keep immigrant families together, adopt smart and humane enforcement policies, and ensure that immigrants without legal status register with the government and begin a path toward citizenship." Over 11,000 individual postcards were collected and delivered to Senators Schumer and Gillibrand and nine Representatives in New York and Northern Pennsylvania. Additional postcards were mailed directly by parishes or individuals. The Diocesan Public Policy Committee thanks all those who coordinated these efforts in parishes as well as those who participated.

At this time, it seems unlikely that immigration legislation will be introduced in the Senate before the November elections. However, legislators have clearly received the message that New York voters recognize that our immigration system is broken and in need of repair. Failing to enlist any Republican co-sponsors for a Comprehensive Immigration Reform Bill (CIR), Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, along with Sens. Dick Durbin, Patrick Leahy, Chuck Schumer, Diane Feinstein and Bob Menendez, released a "Conceptual Proposal for Immigration Reform" that may eventually become the basis for legislation. Reps. Ortiz and Gutierrez have introduced a CIR bill in the House of Representatives. Two other related immigration bills are before the House, the DREAM Act which would allow long-time resident young people to pursue higher education or to enlist in military service, and AgJobs which would provide more work visas and greater protections for farmworkers. The proposal introduced by the Senators includes AgJobs and the DREAM Act. The Diocese of Rochester Public Policy Committee will continue to work with the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to advocate for immigration reform.

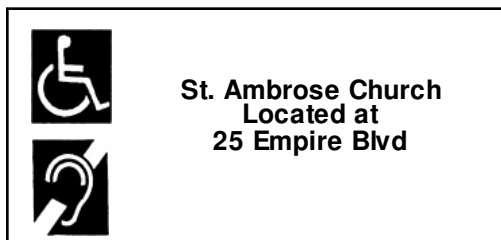

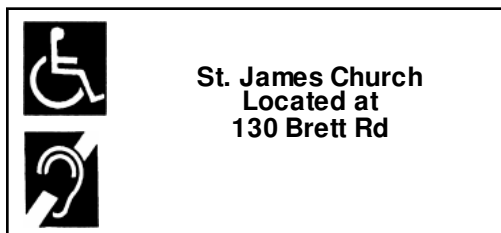

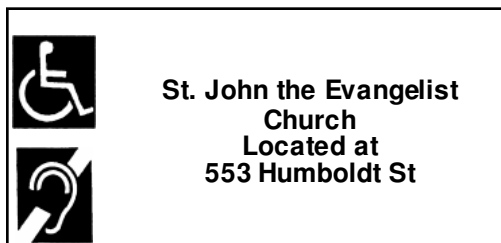
